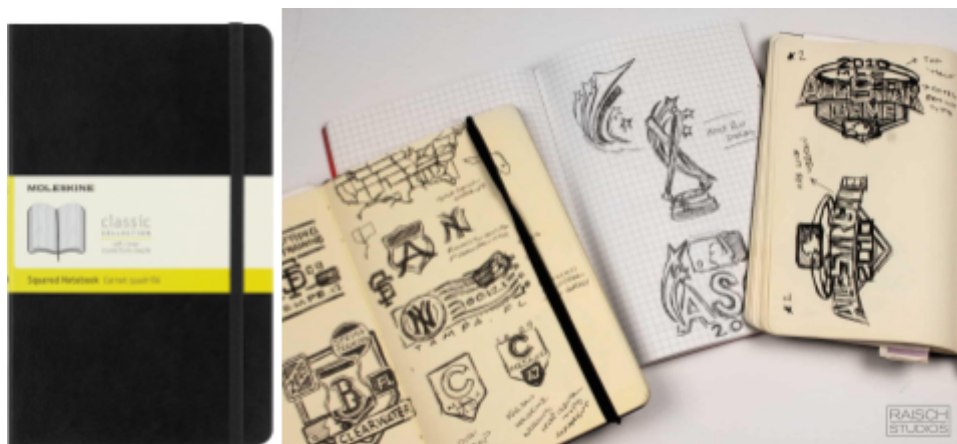

We recommend you purchase a small A5 sketchbook for this subject area. See below for ideas on how you could add to this over the summer. Moleskine sketchbooks are great and come in a range of paper styles. I recommend plain or squared paper for Graphics



The aim of the bridging work is to give you an opportunity to explore and discover various forms of Graphic Design that could inspire your own independent work later in the A Level course. In September you will work in a physical A3 sketchbook and digital portfolio, both are vital tools for documenting your creative thoughts, processes and ideas.

All bridging work must be completed by 20/9 and forms part of your Pupil Passport at Coombe Wood Sixth Form.

BRIDGING TASKS

- **A5 Sketchbook Starting Points** (*Select at least 2*)

Brand Design

Create a series of hand drawn logo designs for a new brand. Develop your brand carefully with different symbols, typefaces, colour schemes and layouts. Your brand could literally be anything, clothing, gaming, takeaway. The choice is completely yours! Aims for 5-10 pages in your A5 sketchbook.

London Museum or Gallery Visit

Head into London over the summer and visit the Design Museum or the Museum of Branding. There is currently an Barbie Exhibition on at the Design Museum which showcases the design evolution of the world's most popular dolls.

Graphic Design Collection

Collect as many different examples of unique and interesting Graphics Design for your A5 sketchbook. e.g. Flyers, Photos of posters, packaging, typography etc
