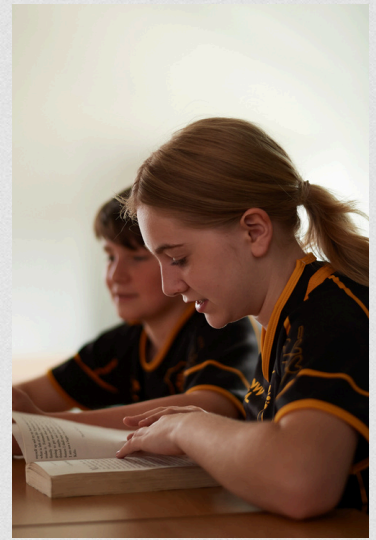

The School Day

Uniform

At CWS we encourage and remind students to take professional pride in their appearance at all times.

As part of our Coombe Woods School culture we allow students to wear HRF kit on the days they are participating in active subjects (HRF/Dance/Games).

If these subjects are not on any particular day's timetable, the expectation is full academic uniform. This enables students to be dressed professionally and appropriately at all times to fully engage with the demands of their curriculum. Outlined below are the non-negotiable expectations and standards of the Coombe Wood School uniform:

Academic Uniform:

- CWS Blazer - to be worn at all times unless given permission to remove
- CWS Tie - must cover all shirt buttons
- White shirt/blouse - tucked in and top button done up
- Grey Jumper (optional)
- Black trousers - worn at an appropriate height around waist (no sagging)
- CWS Skirt (If you opt to wear a skirt- this is the only skirt permitted by the school and the yellow piping must be visible at all times)
- Tights must be plain black and no socks to be worn over tights
- Black formal shoes (no boots/no trainers)
- Black socks only (no sports socks with academic uniform)
- Plain black hijab



Outerwear:

Appropriate coat for the weather is permitted
Appropriate winter hats can be worn outside only

Please ensure that **all** items are clearly marked with your child's name.

Uniform - HRF

HRF Uniform:

- CWS Midlayer Quarter Zip
- CWS House T-Shirt
- CWS Tapered Trackpants
- CWS Shorts / CWS Skort
- Black sports socks only
- Suitable sports footwear



Uniform - Non Negotiables

Non-negotiables:

- No snoods / face coverings
- No hoods up in the building
- No non CWS branded hoodies / mid layers
- No branded sports jackets or quarter zips
- No caps to be worn at any times
- No scarfs to be worn in the building

Jewellery / Hair Expectations and Standards:

- **One small plain** stud in each ear lobe may be worn - no other piercings are permitted
- No other jewellery should be on display or seen
- Natural hair colour only
- No extreme hairstyles - shaved patterns, hair dye, etc
- No headwear to be worn (caps, hats, bonnets, bandanas, or durags)
- Hijabs should be plain black, no patterns
- No acrylic or painted nails
- No fake eye lashes
- Makeup should not be noticeable

Forgotten Uniform / Equipment

If a student is not wearing a required item of uniform or has forgotten any equipment, they are expected to temporarily swap one of the following personal items with the office for the required item:

- Mobile phone
- House keys
- Zip card

The swapped item will be securely stored and returned at the end of the school day when the borrowed uniform is returned.

Lost Property

Lost Property is kept in the main office. Named items of lost property will be returned to their owners where possible.

Everything will be disposed of at the end of each half term (it will be donated to CWSA or charity shop).

Care of Possessions

Please ensure that all uniform items are clearly marked with the students name and these markings are regularly checked and refreshed

The School takes no responsibility for the loss of any technological devices or valuables (including jewellery/watches etc.) and will not investigate any loss.

Students are encouraged to hand in valuables during extra curricular sporting activities or take their belongings with them to the sporting area. For HRF & Games lessons bags will remain in the teaching space with students

Student Lockers

Lockers are available for students and each locker is big enough to securely hold some school books, kit or equipment.

We request payment of £25 which is refundable at the end of the agreed term, provided the terms of the locker contract are adhered to. Payment is to be made via Parent Pay once you have set up your account.

Students are required to read and sign the locker contract themselves. Paper copies of the locker contract can be collected from the school office.

Please email any locker requests to enquiries@coombwoodschool.co.uk including your child's name and tutor group by 31st October 2025. We will then send out a locker contract or your child can collect a copy of the contract from the Office.

Once full payment and the signed contract are received, we will be able to issue the locker key for your child to collect from the Office.

End of Term









At the end of the term, (when your child leaves, or if they no longer require a locker) the student will be required to return the key. We will carry out an inspection to ensure the locker is clean and in good condition with no damage. If everything is satisfactory we will either refund via parent pay, or we will send you a form with details on how your refund will be issued. Please note that if the key is not returned, £5.00 will be deducted from your original deposit to cover the cost of replacement.

Replacement Keys

Should the student require a replacement locker key, please email enquiries@coombwoodschool.co.uk to request this. We will then add the charge of £5.00 to your Parent Pay account. Please notify us payment has been made and then we will order the replacement key. Please note that replacement keys often have to be ordered and can take up to 7-10 working days to arrive.

Equipment

To maximise learning time, all students are expected to be prepared for the day. Along with any subject specific equipment needed, students should bring in the following 8 pieces of equipment every day:

1. Black pen 	2. Purple pen 	3. Pencil 	4. Ruler 
5. Highlighter 	6. Scientific calculator 	7. Reading book 	8. Mini whiteboard pack (provided by school in September) 

- If students have forgotten any of these items, they can borrow equipment from the main office between **8 and 8.25am**. We want to support students in developing their independence and organisation: as such, students who borrow equipment before the start of the school day will not receive a behaviour point for doing so.
- During AM tutor time, Tutors will conduct a daily equipment check.
- If any of the equipment is missing, students will be given a behaviour point. They should then go to the office to borrow missing equipment so they are prepared for the rest of the day.
- Any further instances of missing equipment throughout the school day (e.g. forgotten exercise books) will also result in a behaviour point.
- If students receive 3+ behaviour points for lack of equipment, this will result in an hour detention after school.
- We will provide students with a mini whiteboard pack in September (which includes a mini whiteboard, rubber and whiteboard pen). If students lose their whiteboard pack, we will not be able to replace it.
- Equipment packs are available for purchase on ParentPay at a discounted price. Please see the school website for more information!

If you have any concerns with resourcing the equipment, please contact the school and we will be more than happy to help.

HABITS for Learning

As we all know, achieving success in life - whether that be academically, professionally, socially, or physically - comes through forming and relentlessly sticking to good habits. By sticking to these good habits, we ultimately find that some of the most challenging pursuits in life can be achieved. We find that we can do more than we ever thought possible.

At Coombe Wood School, our **HABITS** for Learning clearly define the habitual behaviours we want to see in our students in order to unlock their potential. When practiced repeatedly, we are confident that these habits will contribute to better progress and outcomes for our students, setting them up for success in their education and in the wider world.

As habitual behaviours are learned over time, we explicitly teach our HABITS for Learning at Coombe Wood. We support our students in developing these HABITS through consistency: our common cues, routines and codified behaviours, reinforced by our behaviour policy and reward policy.

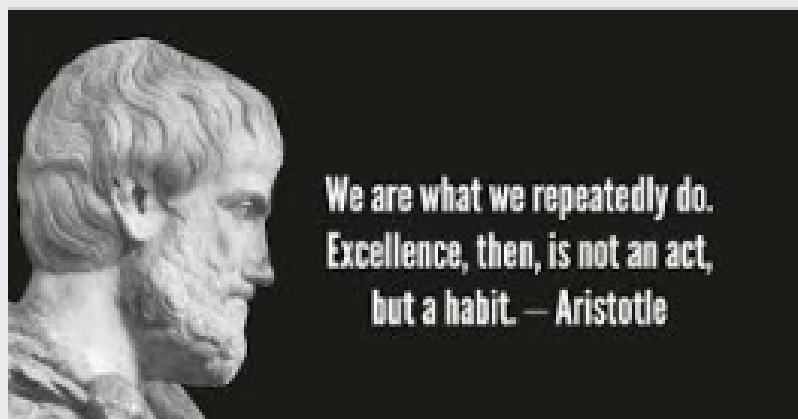
Our CWS Learning **HABITS** are designed to create an environment where everybody thrives and can achieve excellent outcomes both academically and personally.

Behaviour at Coombe Wood School

At Coombe Wood School our expectations for behaviour are designed with the following goal in mind - To create an environment where everyone can:

- Be and feel safe (physically and psychologically)
- Learn without distractions
- Become the very best version of themselves, both during their school journey and beyond.

Consequences Explained

Consequences for poor choices can play an important role in encouraging reflection and helping students improve their understanding of what is and is not in line with our values and expectations.

Every decision that is made from a behaviour focus has the intention to create and protect the best learning environment possible for all of our students at Coombe Wood School. One where everyone can:

- Be and feel safe (physically and psychologically)
- Learn without distractions
- Become the very best version of themselves, both during their school journey and beyond.

Consequences used at Coombe Wood School:

- Pastoral conversations
- Parent meetings
- Detentions
- Loss of privileges
- Loss of social time
- Community Service
- Internal Suspension
- External Suspension
- Permanent Exclusion

Behaviour In Lessons

We believe that every student is entitled to disruption-free lessons. We also believe students should be provided with support and opportunities to 'get it right' when they make poor choices.

What is disruptive behaviour? Anything that detracts from a focused learning environment. Some examples are:

- Calling out
- Talking across the classroom
- Not following instructions first time
- Distracting others
- Lack of work/engagement/effort
- Talking over the teacher
- Damage of property
- Eating in class
- Using inappropriate language
- Lack of focus on the work

We have a clear 3-stage system:

- **STAGE 1 - REMINDER:** The teacher will clarify the unacceptable behaviour, and reinforce the behaviour they would like to see.
- **STAGE 2 - WARNING:** The teacher will issue a verbal warning that the behaviour continues to fall short of expectations
- **STAGE 3 - REMOVAL:** If the students' behaviour continues to disrupt the learning environment they will be removed and parked in a subject referral room for the remainder of the lesson. A same day 1-hour detention will be set.

A teacher may skip the stages and go straight to removal stage if the behaviour is significantly impacting the learning environment or is in anyway offensive or dangerous

Failure to attend the 1-hour Whole School Detention will result in a 1-day internal suspension the following day until 16:00.

Communication Home

All Achievement Points, Behaviour Points and Detentions will be communicated through the My Child At School app.

Routines for the Classroom

At Coombe Wood School we have clear routines so no learning time is wasted.

ENTRY ROUTINE	EXIT ROUTINE
1. Teachers stands at the threshold and greets / welcomes students at the door, addressing any uniform issues from the start.	1. Students pack away in silence
2. Students enter the classroom <u>calmly and quietly</u>	2. Students stand behind chairs in silence
3. Students <u>remove</u> coats, put <u>bags on the floor</u> , sit down in the seating plan and immediately complete the DO NOW task in silence.	3. Teacher checks uniform

Behaviour at Social Times

Our high expectations of students' behaviour is maintained during social times.

Everyone has the right to enjoy break times and feel safe and supported.

Our students are expected to behave in a respectful manner towards others and our environment, ensuring our site is free from litter.

- We are polite and respectful to everyone at all times, staff and students
- We follow instructions first time, every time
- We do not walk away from a member of staff
- We have a **HANDS OFF** policy at Coombe Wood School. We keep our hands to ourselves at all times.

Break times are an opportunity to relax, chat with friends, and rest, ready for the next part of the school day.

Students that fail to meet our expectations during social times may have these times removed and instead be supervised by members of a staff.



Behaviour in the Community

We want our students to wear the uniform with pride and represent our school positively at all times.

From the minute you put the uniform on to the minute you take it off, you are a member of our school community.

At Coombe Wood School we care about our community, this includes our local residents, our tram and bus drivers, our shop keepers and each other. We expect students to conduct themselves with the same levels of respect, maturity and self-regulation that we see in school.

- We call out our peers when they aren't behaving appropriately in the community
- We report poor behaviour in the community to our teachers because we have the compassion for those in our local community
- Coombe Wood School teachers look to catch our students doing the right thing so we can reward excellent behaviour in the community

We hold both students and parents accountable for any breach of the community conduct agreement.

The Department for Education is clear: behaviour outside school is the parents' responsibility.

The school will issue consequences for any behaviour that brings the school into disrepute.



Rewards

We reward students for going above and beyond our expected standards both in and out of lessons.

We give Achievement Points at Coombe Wood School:

- To motivate and encourage our students
- To reinforce the behaviours of being a successful student at CWS
- To celebrate and praise our students contribution to the community
- To underpin and promote the WHY behind our values and expectations

Additional Rewards:

- Positive praise in lessons, tutor times and assemblies
- Weekly recognition letters from the Headteacher for the highest Achievement Points with 0 Behaviour Points each week
- Weekly recognition letter for all students that achieve 5+ Achievement Points with 0 Behaviour Points
- Positive phone calls and emails home
- Rewards lunches with Head of Year / Headteacher
- Half-Termly rewards assemblies - certificates and recognition for academic and pastoral achievement.
- Termly rewards assemblies - certificates and recognition for academic and pastoral achievement + vouchers and rewards trips
- Student of the Year presentation
- Subject specific rewards
- Canteen Queue jumps



My Child at School (MCAS)

What is MCAS?

MCAS (My Child At School) is an online platform we use to monitor and record student behaviour and attendance. It helps us keep track of student progress and ensure a positive learning environment.

How We Use MCAS:

Behaviour: Positive and negative behaviours are logged, giving us a clear picture of each student's conduct. This helps us support students in maintaining good behaviour and recognising their achievements.

Parents and students can access MCAS to stay informed about attendance and behaviour records, ensuring everyone is on the same page.

Attendance :We use My Child At School to manage attendance. Parents must use it to report daily absences (with the child's details and reason), notify the school about illness, and log planned absences such as medical appointments. Requests for leave of absence are also submitted through the school, while unauthorised absences (including holidays in term time) are not approved.



Attendance

Illness

Regular attendance at school is essential for your child's learning and wellbeing. The school expects all students to achieve 96%+ attendance. Attendance is closely monitored, and persistent absence may trigger further action in line with legal requirements.

Illness

If your child is unwell, it is crucial to report their absence via the **My Child At School app**. The app can be easily downloaded from the App Store or Google Play. Please notify the school as soon as possible, preferably before 8:00 am.

When reporting an absence, provide:

- Your child's full name
- Form e.g. *7 Henman, 10 Coleridge*
- Form tutor's name
- Brief reason for absence

Important:

- Log this information for **each day** your child is unable to attend.
- If your child has sickness or diarrhoea, **do not send them back to school until 24 hours after symptoms have ceased.**

If your child becomes unwell during the school day:

- They should go directly to the **school office**.
- The school office will contact you if your child is too unwell to remain at school.
- Students should **not** contact parents using personal mobile phones.

Attendance - cont

Other term time leave/absences

All other absences (except illness) including medical appointments, require the **Leave of Absence form**.

- Whenever possible, schedule appointments **outside of school hours**.
- If an appointment must occur during school hours, provide a note **at least three days in advance**:
 - Show the note to your child's Form Tutor
 - Provide a copy to the school office
- Parents or carers should be prepared to **collect their child** for these appointments.

Leave of absence will only be considered in **exceptional circumstances**, such as compassionate grounds.

Unauthorised absences

Unauthorised absences are those which the school does not consider reasonable, or for which leave has not been granted.

- The school is the authorising body for absences.
- Holidays during term time are not authorised under any circumstances.
- If a child is absent for 3 consecutive days due to illness, the school may request medical evidence to avoid the absence being marked as unauthorised. Examples of acceptable medical evidence include:
 - A doctor's note or appointment card
 - Prescriptions or pharmacy labels
 - Hospital discharge letters or clinic appointment confirmations

In the event your child has 90% or lower attendance, medical evidence will always be required for any absence.

Attendance - cont

Unauthorised absences

Unauthorised absences are those which the school does not consider reasonable, or for which leave has **not** been granted.

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 - Hospital discharge letters or clinic appointment confirmations

In the event your child has 90% or lower attendance, medical evidence will always be required for any absence.

Anecdotal information, such as a parent's phone call or message describing symptoms, is not considered medical evidence and will not authorise an absence.

Legal Expectations

- Attendance is a legal requirement.
- The school monitors attendance closely to ensure compliance.
- Persistent or unauthorised absences may result in further legal action from the local authority - this is outlined in our school attendance policy.

Mobile Phones

At Coombe Wood School we have a very clear stance on mobile phones and all other connected devices (airpods, headphones, etc):

- Phones and all other electronic devices should be placed away in a school bag or zipped blazer pocket at all times and before the enter the school building
- Phones must be switched off and not placed on silent
- If a phone or other banned electronic device are seen or heard on school site it will be confiscated

Students will be encouraged to begin turning phones off and putting them away once through the threshold green gates.

Confiscations:

1st occasion - phone is confiscated for 24 hours. Phone can be collected at the end of the next school day

2nd occasion - phone is confiscated for 48 hours. Phone can be collected at the end of the 2nd school day.

3rd occasion - phone is confiscated for 5 school days. The parent meets with the Head of Year to discuss phone use and arrangements for this moving forward.

Reading at Coombe Wood School

At Coombe Wood School, we believe in the unequivocal power of reading and want our students to fully understand its importance.

Reading develops students' ability to decode and comprehend, expands their vocabulary to unlock learning across the curriculum and offers them an opportunity to build a deeper understanding of the world through the lens of various settings, characters and eras. As such, a significant focus is placed on promoting a culture of reading across the school.

All students are expected to bring a reading book as part of their daily equipment, which they read silently during morning tutor time. Along with suggested reading lists, students have regular access to the school library and receive guidance on reading choices to help them grow as independent readers.

Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4 students also participate in a tutor time reading programme. Led by their tutor, students read high quality, appropriately challenging texts as a class, further cultivating the habit of reading for all pupils.

All students are assessed for their reading ages on a biannual basis. For students identified as needing additional support, we run targeted reading interventions groups over the course of the year, including phonics and reading fluency interventions.

Co-Curricular



We are incredibly proud of the wide range of Co-Curricular opportunities available to students at Coombe Wood School.

While the majority of clubs take place after school, a selection of sporting and performing arts activities are also offered during the school day. Each club presents a valuable opportunity to build cultural capital, enriching the educational journey rather than serving as curriculum catch-up. Co-Curricular activities that complement the traditional curriculum significantly enhance the student experience and broaden horizons for those who participate.

In addition to sports and dance, our programme has included STEM, Coding, Podcasting, Choir, Musicals, Journalism, Art, Textiles, Book Club, Ukulele, Maths, Chess, Debate, Languages, History, Baking, Duke of Edinburgh (DofE), Manga, and many more.

Students will also have the opportunity to take part in school productions and sports fixtures, as well as attend educational visits and trips throughout the school year, further enriching their personal development and learning beyond the classroom.

All students in Years 7–9 are expected to attend at least one club per week. Students in Key Stages 4 and 5 are encouraged to engage with the Co-Curricular programme alongside their academic commitments.

Student Support

At Coombe Wood School, we are committed to supporting the well-being and mental health of all our students.

While we are not medical professionals, we strive to provide guidance, support, and access to appropriate services whenever possible. We understand that mental health challenges can be difficult and that many external services may have long waiting lists, but we always aim to help students access the support they need and to keep them engaged in school.

Support available at school includes:

- **Mental Health DSL Lead** – Channelle Hutchinson, who oversees mental health concerns and coordinates support.
- **School Counsellor** – Rennee Bond, offering confidential guidance for students.
- **ELSA trained support staff** – providing emotional literacy support for students who may need additional guidance.
- **Croydon Drop-In Student Trainees** – offering a friendly, approachable space for students to discuss wellbeing concerns.
- **SEND Team** – supporting students with special educational needs, including mental health needs.
- **Pastoral / Year Leaders** – the first point of contact for wellbeing concerns, helping students navigate challenges at school.
- **Safeguarding Team** – working closely with mental health support services to ensure students' safety and wellbeing.
- **Peer Mentoring** – students providing peer-to-peer support, fostering connection and understanding.
- **Referral Pathways** – where needed, we help students access external services such as CAMHS (Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services) and Early Help.

We understand that accessing timely support can sometimes be challenging due to high demand. However, we remain committed to doing everything we can within the school to support students' mental health and ensure they feel safe, supported, and able to engage in their learning.

Mental Health and Wellbeing

Health and wellbeing are at the heart of everything we do at Coombe Wood School, as we continually strive to be the healthiest school for our students.
